Dear Woodlands Watch Coordinators,

In the past few days several of you have received an e-mail regarding an incident in the Glen Trace neighborhood of Alden Bridge. Neighborhood Services has contacted the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office in order to obtain the facts about this incident:

- On the evening of Sunday, March 22, a white Ford pick-up truck pulled up in front of a residence in Glen Trace. A female passenger went to the door of the residence and rang the door bell. When the homeowner answered the door, the woman asked if the Suburban parked in the driveway of the residence was for sale. The homeowner said no.
- Because the homeowner thought it was odd for someone to ask if a car that did not have a "for sale" sign was for sale, she contacted the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office and gave dispatch the license plate number of the Ford pick-up.
- A sheriff's officer responded to the call and took the information. The officer ran the plate number and nothing showed up to indicate that there was any problem with this vehicle.

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office has told us that there is no indication that the occupants of the white Ford pick-up seen in Glen Trace are "people of concern". There are no "red flags" currently associated with these individuals.

This incident does serve as a reminder, however, of the following:

- **Never** open the door to anyone you do not know.
- **Contact** law enforcement when you notice anything that seems suspicious.
- **Lock** your doors.
- **Check** with Neighborhood Services regarding the accuracy of any e-mail you receive before you forward it to anyone else.

We appreciate those of you who sent this e-mail on to us before you forwarded it further. Too often e-mails regarding crimes are complete fabrications, such as urban legends, or have been exaggerated.

According to the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, the most common criminal activity in The Woodlands continues to be the theft of items taken out of unlocked vehicles.
